
NEARLY ONE IN FIVE (19%) ARE PROVIDING

WHO ARE THE CAREGIVERS?

- 61-75+% of all caregivers are female, spend as much as 50% more time providing care than males
- Average age: 49.2, 34% are 65+







CAREGIVING DEMOGRAPHICS

- Race/ethnicity: 62% White, 13% African American, 17% Hispanic, 6% Asian American
- Prevalence: Hispanic 21%, African American 20.3%, Asian American 19.7%, White 16.9%
- 9% have served in active duty in the US Armed Forces
- 8% of caregivers identify as LGBTQ

INCREASING NUMBER OF CARE RECIPIENTS

More Americans are caring for more than one person.




- 24% caring for 2 or more recipients
- 3 in 10 caregivers also live with a child or grandchild
- 89% of caregivers care for a relative or loved one

More family caregivers report their own health is fair to poor.



COVID-19 MENTAL HEALTH IMPACTS

• 1/3 of Americans are showing signs of clinical depression or anxiety



COVID-19 IMPACTS ON OLDER ADULTS

- Older adults are at significantly increased risk of severe disease and death following infection
- ~85% of deaths from COVID-19 in California have been in adults 60+ per CDPH
 - 45% of TOTAL deaths have been in residents of skilled nursing facilities
- Concern re: social isolation as a risk factor for medical and mental health disorders

COVID-19 IMPACT ON GRANDPARENTS

"COVID-19 is creating a new cohort of people who are identifying themselves as caregivers for the first time because it's creating a need that hadn't been there."

COVID IMPACT ON CAREGIVERS

- 82% of caregivers say stress is higher
- 74% more concerned about finances
- 37% said sheltering in place was creating additional tension about keeping a loved one at home
- 24% said it was hard for them to be close to a loved one with Alzheimer's 24/7
- 32% want additional government support for their caregiving

COVID-19 IMPACTS ON CAREGIVERS IN OC

- · Less availability for and greater anxiety around respite care- day care, friends/family
- Disruption in access to health care and support networks
- Lack of transportation options
- Social isolation/separation from loved ones

INTERVENTIONS TO HELP CAREGIVERS & OLDER ADULTS

- Respite care
 - Transportation
- House cleaning, meals, home health aide/physical therapy
- Education
- · Advocacy for public policy and funding
 - Income tax credit
 - Caregiver pay
 - Paid leave

ACTION ITEMS:

- Proposed CA Budget Cuts to IHSS, Caregiver Resource Centers, elimination of Community Based Adult Services and Multipurpose Senior Services Program -> cuts to all Adult Day Care programs
- At our organizations/workplace
- In our lives and communities
